PACKED, MOVED, UNPACKED, ORGANIZING AND PRODUCING

IN JULY, WE MOVED THE SHOP TRUCKLOAD BY TRUCKLOAD. WHEW!

Dozens of volunteers worked as teams on each end of the move to load and unload multiple semis. Dell Epperson, board Trustee & building committee, led the team at the old shop on Heriford Rd. The old building was left bare.

Dennis Canote, board Trustee & building committee, led the team at the new shop on E Meyer Industrial Drive. It was hot and tiring work in July. Unloading boxes and organizing ensued over many days and weeks. The office and conference rooms of the new site was the last to be completed and have furniture to move into. So the office move happened separately. The shop is in Mobility Cart production, but the office is still in process.

At the end of July, Jim Wall, board Trustee, and Mel West, our founder, did the first ceremonial first cart build.

These are some excerpts of emails Gary sent to volunteers to give you a feel of recent activity.

July 29 Yes we are building carts again. I hope to see my assembly teams soon.... AND WE ALL WEAR MASKS.

August 4 We are building 15-25 carts a week - all three styles. Right now to keep social distancing practiced as much as possible we are packing twice a week. So today we boxed 12 and again on Thursday we will box whatever we make in 3 days of working.... New volunteers toured today so the word is out, we still are a great place to work.

August 8 Instructor Harold Bossaller has the welding room ready for training as you can see in the attached photos. There has been several volunteers wanting to learn how to weld and he is ready next week to train those.... I am shipping all pull carts to Hospital Sisters Mission in Springfield, IL....

I have requested a container to load out in the next couple of weeks to Kenya. That will lower the inventory significantly before we get the influx of 58 carts from the Craft Beer and Carts (Rotaract Club fundraiser). So after August 30 in addition to any carts built, we will have 58 carts to break down and box during September. That will quickly fill another container for Kenya.

August 13 Today on Thursday we boxed up 22 carts, good representation of all 3 styles.... The warehouse is storing all the supplies at about max acquisition. We just got 6 months of tires and one year of L brackets from Hubbell Power Systems. So we can store it all well with some empty spaces.

August 24 Last week our Board suggested in an air of safety and healthiness to cancel this year's Aug 30 Craft Beer and Carts as well as the Open House on September 17....

Regarding the Open House: Instead watch for the Facebook Live Tour and Interviews conducted that day around the shop. You will get a tour hosted by Monica Pitts and MayeCreate Design.




VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT


LARRY HILLS

We want to pay tribute to all our volunteers over our 26 years of mission. They have been a dedicated team. Occasionally we are saddened as one passes. We put their name, city and state on a memorial plaque in our building.

Larry Hills recently passed. He was the missionary in Africa that asked our founder, Mel West, for 'one' more thing back in 1994. That became the Mobility Cart to which over 85,000 have been produced worldwide so far - over 26,000 in Columbia alone.

Bob Battern worked assembling carts, making parts, and finally assembled shelving units. He was awarded the 10 year volunteer plague in April 2018. Soon after that he moved to IA. He passed this year and his son sent this message to our Executive Director:


