This February, we received the before and after pictures of the 100 recipients of your sponsored Craft Beer & Carts last summer. Mary, staff of Partners for Care, coordinates the distribution to those in need of mobility and sends these photos. In that group of 100 were many flip flops. They are used to protect their hands when they crawl. Not only for comfort, but to avoid scratches and cuts that could lead to infections. That is just one of different kinds of items used. I’ve seen wooden blocks with handles, skateboard, Sometimes, the person crawling with a leg disability will also attach something to protect their knees like tying on a pair of tennis shoes. The man pictured on the Rotary Youth Exchange cart has hands and knees protected. Thank YOU for helping all these Kenyans. They are so grateful, amazed and happy when they receive your Mobility Cart. **One of our board trustees, Jim Weisbrook, who went to distribute carts in Kenya last November reported Jeremiah thanked them continuously.**

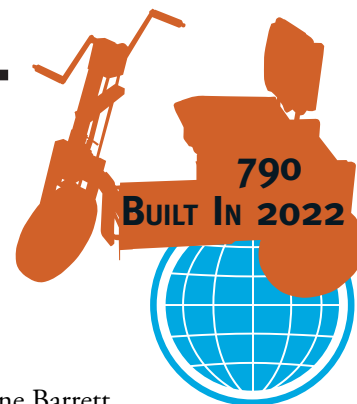

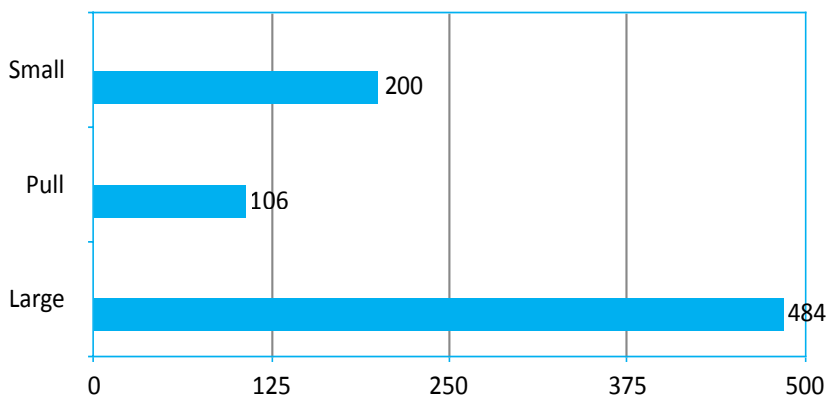

NOE UPGRADES IN HONDURAS

It is not uncommon for someone to be given a standard wheelchair that does not hold up long or work well for the recipient, especially in rural conditions. In this case, the Department Association of Disabled persons in Honduras moved Noe to a Mobility Cart. They made a short video and a volunteer translated for us.

This family has received this cart as a donation from our American brothers, who send these carts to our communities. And we're showing you this donation to this beautiful family.
