SPRING INTO MOBILITY


It is spring time in the Columbia shop. And volunteers are bringing alive each week 50 carts. **The budget in 2023 is allowing production each week for 35 large carts, 5 Pull carts and 10 small carts.** We have welding volunteers producing almost all the metal parts in house. Additionally, the Farmer City Welders led by Glen Rolf produce twice a year over 800 brake handles and 200 small frames. We have woodworkers producing wood pieces that keep the assembly teams busy. Additional wood help comes from Warrensburg and O'Fallon, MO.



Eight to ten final cart assembly teams put them all together each week; so that 50 carts are ready for the packing crew on Tuesdays. It all happens because most of the volunteers are coming by friends inviting friends to come and see what is going on. The atmosphere is a fun place to work. Locals are bringing their spouses along to help out. Keeping in mind, that several are working along in The Sewing Machine Project room at the same time. Jim Sandfry repurposed 433 sewing machines in 2022 with many weekly helpers.

Volunteers are coming from all walks of life and finding a real purpose to retirement. Sure, they still travel, take a few weeks off to enjoy family scattered around. But all come back to serve the disabled. We are blessed with the dedication. It makes operating a shop much less painful when parts are slow to arrive.

With the help of all, we have budgeted 2,600 carts for 2023. Will we make it? Will the donors continue to send \$350.00 to build another cart? Pray for us and pray how you can help. Watch for our spring and fall match opportunities.



Update: AmazonSmile came to an end on February 20. Amazon has decided to stop this program of giving a % from purchases made to the charity of your choice. We do not know how many of you participated and chose our non-profit. But we know you had; as increasing, quarterly gifts were deposited into our account. Over the last 10 years, we received \$2,025 because you signed up. Seven more lives changed with a Mobility Cart. It all adds up. *THANKYOU*



4 carts were payroll pledged through **MSECC** (**MO State Employees Charitable Campaign**).


52 carts were given by 86 families through **CoMoGives (county drive)**.

The Marurui slums, home to roughly 25,000 - 30,000 people, was a stark reminder that there are poor and destitute people in the world. (For the most part, we are so insulated from this environment in the U.S.) Still, we are reminded that there is life in this community, that commerce is staking place with some very entrepreneurial people, that every life is valuable, and that disability is not inability. There may be despair, and hopelessness for many, but with the Kenyan government's mandate for education for all kids through high school, people are finding a way to pay for their kids' education, helping them to have a better life. **PFC's initiatives assist in those efforts with their Mobility Worldwide partnership offering Mobility Carts to the disabled, plus providing access to computer, sewing and other skills, providing for access to better health and medical care, and providing access to employment opportunities. It was a most interesting day! Alan Wessler"**

"Kilifi regional center: Then came the big moment, time to assemble the Mobility Carts! Fortunately, we were each paired with an experienced assembler, or we might still be there. <u>Ten recipients were seated near their carts.</u> <u>Some chose to help assemble as best they could. Some just observed closely</u>.

As each cart came together, the anticipation grew. We helped each to get on board for a test drive. The learning curve to gain motion is a small one and soon they were zipping about. Shouts of glee and, at the least, broad smiles abounded. What a blessing we all felt!

GOOD NEWS ON NEW YEAR'S DAY

"Greetings,

... This is to inform you, we have offloaded container. It arrived on Sunday morning New Year's Day... We are grateful Mobility Worldwide MO - Columbia for the generous donation to make our people mobile. The sewing machines to empower our people. Blessings, Mary Wang'ang'a" Partners for Care staff in charge of mobility distribution across Kenya.

On September 15, 2022, we sent out the container shipment full to PFC. It took 3 1/2 months in transit since leaving Columbia. Contents included 140 Mobility Carts, 50 Mini-Marts, many used devices (walkers, crutches & more), and

other items from two of our connected partners. In December and February, we sent more overseas containers full with your help. We contributed \$7,173 toward the shipment of the December container that arrived in February.
