

WE NEED YOU

HELP IS NEEDED IN VARIOUS AREAS.

For the past year, we have hired The QL Group (Steve Andriano, who also volunteers) to upgrade our manufacturing processes. The board reviewed his proposal and approved. The intent is to help us grow in our production – help more persons with leg handicaps. For increasing to 50 Mobility Carts a week in 2023 and more going forward as donations allow. A lead volunteer for each area of the shop works with Steve to implement. Our Executive

Director is overseeing the whole process and expenditures. We reorganized when we moved in 2020. Now are reorganizing for better work flow and efficiency of volunteer time and your donor dollars to build more carts.

This maturing of our organization includes work instructions at each station on how to do that task. The instructions answer where are the tools, which screw to use, order of steps, etc. No one has to remember solely what Joe said last time. Current volunteers can review each time as a reminder and look for any changes. But when new volunteers come in, they are trained using the instructions on an iPad at the station. Then when they come in next week, they can follow the instructions. Please come in for a tour and see how you might fit in. Bring a friend.



Costs Are Still High

Since November 2021, we have said the cost was \$350 to build and ship a Mobility Cart. In 2022 with supply chain issues continuing, we were only able to produce 27 per week. The average cost with all expenses including utilities and things like insurance was \$467 per cart for the year. (Check out the 2022 Annual Report inserted in this summer newsletter.) We created and approved a 2023 budget estimating \$417 per cart. Staff hoped supplies & shipping costs would drop some, and we'd be able to produce more carts, which would lessen the per cart \$.

Lumber has gone down this year .40 per board, but not near the \$3 it went up in recent years. A small, steel fork (drawing from engineering print) went up \$20 each from 2020 to 2022. We have not seen a decline yet. We are looking at ways to make changes and still build a reliable and durable mobility device. In April, our board of Trustees discussed and approved raising our promoted average cost to \$425 for a Mobility Cart (any model). We think this will be more in line with actual costs.
