#### WHAT DOES A CENTURY AND OUR FOUNDER HAVE IN COMMON?


Rev. Mel West, our founder, turns 100 in May. It all started on a dairy farm in MO where he grew up milking Jersey cows and learning about what was important and how to treat others. He graduated from University of MO in Columbia / Mizzou where he met his wife,

Barbara. He was a Marine. He started or was a part of many non-profits helping people around the globe through organizations like Heifer & Habitat for Humanity.

leg has a brace and her left foot a cast. (Photo courtesy of Partners for Care.) She is one example of the need around the globe that Mel worked to help with your generous assistance. At 95 years old in 2019, he received an honorary doctorate from Mizzou for his decades of humanitarian work. Former President Jimmy Carter was one of six notable people who nominated West for the honorary degree. This is only a tiny portion of the stories that could be told about his

"So, I have ended up with farming background, and as an ecumenical, liberal, progressive Christian. For me that is a great mixture, though it troubles some." Our mission turns 30 years old in 2024. Mobility Carts were started in 1994 in response to Missionary Larry Hill's request for 'one more thing'. Mel was already sending supplies to Larry in Africa, but Larry wanted to also help those with leg handicaps. In rural areas, where standard wheelchairs will not work. Many were affected by landmines and polio. Mel got help from Earl Miner, product designer, and shipped the first four to Larry to test. A lever handled model was first made, but soon changed to the crank cart we have today.

As the years passed, improvements were made to make the cart more durable and last for years like hardened sprockets and solid tires. They will not last forever; but with some replacement parts like new tires or minor repair, they can last 5 to 10 years. We have had reports of some over 10 years old. This is why we also ship supplies for maintanence when our Distribution Partners have an ongoing presence.

The Small Crank Cart was developed next to help children. But that also helped adults with drawfism or other difficulties. See picture from

In 2004, a team in Columbia answered Mel's call to create a governing body that would oversee and assist the growing number of production shops. Currently, there are 19 US and 2 African shops. In 2015, our mission family celebrated the 50,000<sup>th</sup> cart. July 2020, we moved into our new and first owned building; fully paid for. February 2023, our Columbia shop reached 30,000 carts built by our volunteers alone. Last fall, we all began celebrating the 100,000<sup>th</sup> Mobility Cart built and distributed in El Salvador (pictured in the last newsletter). That was 14 years after the report from ADHU above in 2009. The need is still there. The international level of our mission family has more orders than all our shops can fill at the moment. So we look to you, our wonderful supporters, to team up with us to help even more. **Thank YOU for 30 years of changing the world one life at a time.**





The spring season seems to be coming early. That means that Mel West, our mission founder, is turning 100 on May 21. Let's celebrate all together. Come visit him and tour our shop during an Open House on May 9, 3-7 pm. We want you to Honor Mel by purchasing a Mobility Cart, \$425.00, in his honor for starting a Mobility Project at the age of 70 that has turned into a factory of shops. Columbia helped 2,220 persons off the ground in 2023.



A few years ago at our Annual Conference in Austin, TX, Mel challenged all of us to make one country mobile. (Mel is pictured on the cart with MW international leadership in 2019: John Rudd, Scott Walters, and Jim Conn.) Connie Cheren from Partners for Care took that challenge on in Kenya. They are going to do it county by county, and this Spring they expect to have made one county in Kenya completely mobile. That means, they supplied all the

Mobility Carts, wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, canes that they need to give everyone needing a lift up off the ground. Earlier, Rainbow Network working in Nicaragua, sent this report, "...in December 2015, we announced each of our 112 communities to be "100% mobile" through a large distribution of canes, wheelchairs, and Mobility Carts..." What challenges have you made in your retirement years?
